Meet Barnstable's New Police Officers

Barnstable Police Chief Matthew Sonnabend is pleased to announce the addition of five new patrol officers to the force. The five officers were sworn in July 24 at the Barnstable Police Department. Four of the five recently completed recruit officer training at the Cape Cod Municipal Police Academy; one officer is a lateral transfer from Hull Police Department. The officers will begin three months of field training prior to being cleared for solo patrol.



Patrol Officer Thomas Fullam is a United States Coast Guard veteran where he earned the rank of Lieutenant. He holds a Bachelor's Degree from the United States Coast Guard Academy. Officer Fullam worked for the Department as a telecommunicator/jail assistant before attending the police academy. He resides in Hyannis.

Patrol Officer Jonathan Moore was born in Ireland and has lived on Cape Cod since 2002. He is a 2004 graduate of Upper Cape Cod Technical High School. Officer Moore is an active member of the community, having coached both Barnstable Youth Hockey and Barnstable Youth Baseball. Officer Moore resides in Hyannis.





Patrol Officer Owen Murray is a lifelong resident of the Town of Barnstable. He graduated from Barnstable High School in 2015, and then attended Stonehill College, where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Criminology in 2019. Officer Murray resides in Marstons Mills.

Patrol Officer Brandon Sanders is transferring to Barnstable from Hull Police Department, where he has worked full time as a patrol officer for two years. He holds an Associate's Degree in Criminal Justice from Quincy College and is currently enrolled there earning his Bachelor's Degree. Officer Sanders resides in Pembroke.





Patrol Officer Kristina Gustafson was born and raised on Cape Cod. She graduated from Barnstable High School and earned an Associate's Degree in Criminal Justice from Cape Cod Community College. Ms. Gustafson worked for the Department as a telecommunicator/jail assistant before attending the police academy. Officer Gustafson resides in Hyannis.

Police Explorers Program

n September of 2020 the BPD partnered with the Boy Scouts of America to start a Police Explorers Program. The Police Explorers Program is designed to provide local High School–aged students who may be interested in a career in law enforcement a comprehensive program of classroom instruction, officer's personal experiences, and hands-on practical exercises. The explorers are exposed to a wide range of police services the BPD has to offer such as our Community Impact Unit, SWAT Team, K-9 Unit, Traffic Unit, Firearms Training, and Crime Scene Investigations. They will be taught basic patrol tactics as the program progresses. The program is intended to improve community relationships, expand on youth outreach, improve the explorers' character and confidence, and serve as a potential recruiting tool for future BPD Officers. The explorers meet once a week after school for the duration of the school year. All officers involved volunteer their time to help teach and mentor the students. There are currently 12 Barnstable High School students participating in the program, and all desire a career in law enforcement.



Citizens Police Academy

he Citizens Police Academy has been one of the cornerstone programs of our community policing model for decades. The first session kicked off the program in the spring of 1999. Throughout the years the program has been repeatedly honed to get to where it is today. The last class to graduate was the 32nd session, finishing up in January of 2020. Each session we open our doors to approximately 30 members of our community to get an in-depth look at our department. The CPA meets one night a week for almost four months through the fall and winter. Each week the community is treated to meeting different members and units of our department. There are many interactive classes including patrol tactics, field sobriety testing and defensive tactics. Each session also makes a trip to the Barnstable House of Correction and the shooting range.
