
The Domestic Violence Unit currently has a full time Detective and a full time Victim Advocate assigned. Detective Catarina Parache is currentlu assianed as the

Domestic Violence Detective and Civilian Jessica Jay is currently assigned as a full time advocate. Detective Sergeant Meaghan Cunningham oversees this unit and was previously assigned as the Domestic Violence Detective prior to being promoted in September 2019.

Although there is not any mandatory training officers need to investigate domestic violence incidents, we continuously attend training and educate ourselves on high risk domestic violence indicators, trauma, victomology, offender roles, and sexual assaults. Detective Sergeant Meaghan Cunningham and Victim Advocate Jessica Jay are both certified Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Instructors through the Municipal Police Training Committee and teach
