I would like to take a moment and thank Sergeant Kevin Connolly, Detective Catarina Parache, Officer Christopher Botsford and Ms. Jessica Piknik for joining us at the dinner and talking with you. Sergeant Connolly and Officer Botsford were able to display the capabilities of the newest gift of the Bluecoats to the Barnstable Police Department, a 2022 DJI Matrice 30T for \$16,071.00. Since its initial flight on August 7th, the drone has completed 85 field deployments. This new drone will greatly enhance the ability of the Barnstable Police Department to conduct investigations, monitor large public events in real time, and provide for the safety of the public and our officers at the same time. A truly wonderful and generous gift. Thank you.

Detective Parache and Ms. Piknik spoke with you about an aspect of the Barnstable Police Department that not too many others have heard, which is the role the department plays in the support of victims of crime. In particular, some of the most vulnerable people in our community, the women and children who are traumatized by domestic violence and human trafficking. Often these victims lack the support and assistance they need, but Detective Parache, Ms. Piknik, and others in the department work tirelessly to provide victims with resources to prepare them for the fight over in court as well. Hearing them speak to you about their work and witnessing your support for them was amazing.

I may be a bit biased, but I must say that I am proud of


